

CCHE Curriculum Sale Subject Categories List

It's easy to assign a "subject" for most standard curriculum—the core subject is written right on the book! However, assigning a "subject" to other items can be a bit tricky. Sometimes an item will fit into more than one category, and other times it doesn't seem to fit perfectly into any category. This guide has been written to assist you. When in doubt, just use your best judgment.

Mark Subject as:	Examples
Art	Books that teach all different aspects of art, crafts, art/craft supplies, coloring books.
Bible	Bibles, Bible study helps, concordances, Bible dictionaries/atlasses, world view, missionary biographies, devotionals, character studies, doctrinal books.
Domestics & Life Skills	Cookbooks, books on vegetable gardening & taking care of plants, other reference items for taking care of household items. Also sewing and other domestics.
Critical Thinking or Logic	All Critical Thinking Company books should be marked "Critical Thinking", and all other logic books by different publishers should be marked "Logic".
Electronics	<u>All</u> computer games, software, cassettes, CD's, VHS tapes and DVD's.
English: Mark item as "English - " and, one of the following subcategories: Phonics, Reading, Literature, Grammar, Language Mechanics, Writing, Spelling	All English curricula. Also dictionaries, thesauruses, spelling helps, anthologies of classic literature, and grammar references. Books that teach how to write a research paper, resume, or business letters. Examples of how to write the subject: "English – Grammar" or "English – Writing". Note: When an English curriculum teaches writing using a subject such as geography, history or literature, <u>it's still an English curriculum.</u>
Fiction	All fiction—historical fiction, classics, and picture books. Note: If the publisher is "Beautiful Feet Books," write the subject as "Fiction - BF".
Foreign Language	Anything pertaining to foreign language, including dictionaries, foreign language flash cards, etc.
Games	Games, puzzles, any items used for play such as jump ropes, balls, etc.
History or Social Studies (includes Geography & Economics)	Workbooks on Civil War, Ancient Egypt, et cetera; books about armor, guns, pilgrims, Indian tribes; models of forts, castles, western town (could be paper cut-outs or plastic pieces). Also, economics and civics, etc. Note: Beautiful Feet curriculum is "History". Fiction books published by "Beautiful Feet Books" go in the "Fiction" category (see directions above)
Math	Flash cards, workbooks, manipulatives, balances, money and time, and the like.
Music	Music books, keyboards, musical instruments, music history.
Reference	Home school resources, curriculum guides, special needs resources, parenting guides, occupational education, apprenticeships, college preparation, college testing, ministry, marriage, etc.
Science & Technology	Microscopes, chemistry items, workbooks on science experiments, books that deal with animals, seasons, plants, dinosaurs, magnetism, nutrition, health, physical education, and so on.
Unit Study	Amanda Bennett, Five in a Row, Konos, Heart of Wisdom, Sonlight, Steward Ship, Tapestry of Grace, Weaver, etc.
